From the Pastor: On Monday, the Church celebrates the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (body and soul) into Heaven. One of the effects of original sin is the corruption of our bodies after death. Mary was preserved from original sin and never committed a sin during her life so her body need not decay. Her Assumption also gives us a reminder that our bodies and our souls will be reunited at the end of the world.

The tradition in the West has been that Mary died (meaning that her soul separated from her body) before her Assumption; in the East, this feast is known as the Dormition since it believed that Mary did not die but only fell asleep before her Assumption. When Pope Pius XII defined the Dogma of the Assumption in 1954, he stated: "...we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma:

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". As a result, both traditions continue. The log cabin church built here in 1741 was dedicated under the title of the Assumption. In 1851, the Bishop of Philadelphia, Francis Kenrick, consecrated Sacred Heart Church on the Feast of the Assumption. Four days later, he was named Archbishop of Baltimore.
