From the Pastor: On July 6, we celebrated the feast day of St. Maria Goretti. In 1902, when she was twelve, she resisted assault and was killed. Her death was only the beginning of her wonderful story. The man who killed her had a dream in which Maria Goretti appeared to him to offer forgiveness. He repented and did penance for the rest of his life. Her canonization in 1950 was the first to be held outdoors due to the size of the crowd and it was the first to be attended by the mother of the saint.

In his homily, Pope Pius XII said:

"From Maria's story carefree children and young people with their zest for life can learn not to be led astray by attractive pleasures which are not only ephemeral and empty but also sinful. Instead they can fix their sights on achieving Christian moral perfection, however difficult and hazardous that course may prove. With determination and God's help all of us can attain that goal by persistent effort and prayer. Not all of us are expected to die a

martyr's death, but we are all called to the pursuit of Christian virtue. This demands strength of character though it may not match that of this innocent girl. Still, a constant, persistent and relentless effort is asked of us right up to the moment of our death. This may be conceived as a slow steady martyrdom which Christ urged upon us when he said: 'The kingdom of heaven is set upon and laid waste by violent forces'."
