From the Pastor: On Friday, the Church celebrates St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine. St. Augustine is remembered as the Bishop of Hippo and as the author of spiritual works such as: *Confessions* and *The City of God* that have remained popular for nearly 1800 years. None of this would have been possible without the perseverance of St. Monica.

When he was younger, St. Augustine was determined to experience every type of sin and he was very successful at it. His mother was deeply concerned for his eternal salvation. A bishop encouraged her with these words: "Don't worry, it is impossible that a son of so many tears should be lost."

After many years of St. Monica's prayers, her son ended his evil ways and was received into the church when he was 31 years old, eventually being ordained to the priesthood and consecrated a bishop. He served faithfully until his death at age 75.

The conversion of St. Augustine shows how powerful the prayers of a mother are for her child. It also helps us with patience. God has shown that He answers all prayers in time. It is understandable that we want results right away. Many times it seems that God is keeping us at a distance when He makes us wait. He is asking us to make an act of faith by not giving up.
