From the Pastor: Francis Patrick Kenrick was the Bishop of Philadelphia from 1842 until he was named Archbishop of Baltimore in 1851. At that time, Conewago was located within the Diocese of Philadelphia. That August, he began a visitation of parishes in our area. The following is excerpted from his journal:

NINETEENTH EPISCOPAL VISITATION. 1851 I began the visitation of the diocese on the ninth day of August at Lancaster. [Then successively] at York, in a place called Paradise Township, and in the chapel of the Ladies of the Sacred Heart, McSherrystown. August the fifteenth day, 1851. I consecrated solemnly the church of the Most Sacred Heart, near Conewago Creek. This church was built sixty-four years ago under the care of the Rev. Father [James] Pellentz. Lately it has been enlarged and decorated, so that it may be considered as a new church. One hundred and seventy were confirmed in this church on the seventeenth day of August, which was Sunday. 1851, the transept and apse (the wings and the sanctuary) were added to our church and the paintings there were added. In addition, a painting of The Last Supper covered the wall over the altar. It was painted directly onto the plaster. By 1887, roof leaks had damaged the plaster to the point where the painting was considered damaged beyond repair and it was replaced by the painting which hangs there now. The Ladies of the Sacred Heart refers to the order of nuns was the order of nuns that taught at the Conewago Chapel School at that time. They replaced the Sisters of Charity in 1841 who returned to

Emmitsburg when their convent burned. Two days after he administered the Sacrament of Confirmation at Conewago, Bishop Kenrick was named Archbishop of Baltimore.
